A Muscadet, but not quite as you know it, this wine called Miss Terre - a play on the French for mystery - is bright, vibrant, creamy and elegant. Aged on its lees for 9 months and coming from vines ranging from 60 to 80 years old, it is fruity, rich and intense. Sensational.

**Sancerre (organic, ve)** 43

*Sylvian Bailly, Sauvignon Blanc, 2016, Loire, France, 12.5%*

Ever the picture of style and sophistication, fresh green fruits meet high minerality to create this timeless classic. This husband and wife team have created perfect equilibrium in the eastern Loire Valley. Wine bliss.

**Vom Kalk Furmint (biodynamic, natural, ve)** 45

*Franz Weninger, Furmint, 2018, Weinland, Austria, 9.5%*

A fresh and balanced wine that sings of its kalk - chalk - soil. Pure and pristine with flavours of lime and white flowers, a backbone of minerality and hits of acidity and salinity. Happy and beautiful with a long finish and plenty of structure.

**Uberima Palomino (natural, under flor, ve)** 47

*Bodegas Cota 45, Palomino, 2018, Jerez, Spain, 11%*

Winemaker Ramiro Ibáñez Espinar looks to the past and the future with his pioneering wines that use age-old techniques and heritage varietals in modern ways. He also breaks all the rules by making what are effectively unfortified sherry wines. This is unfortified manzanilla - salty, acidic, rich and convivial. It's just less strong and you'll want to drink more.

**Little Bastard (natural, ve)** 47





# We serve natural, biodynamic & low intervention wines...

## what is natural wine?

Natural Wine is farmed organically and made without adding or removing anything in the cellar. No additives or processing aids are used, and intervention is kept to a minimum. They are unfinned and unfiltered, resulting in a living wine with character and personality - sometimes with cloudiness and a slight effervescence.

## what about biodynamic?

The idea behind biodynamics is that everything in the universe is interconnected, including the moon, planets and stars. Biodynamic farming is completely organic, but also follows a special lunar calendar. Additionally, biodynamic wine allows no 'manufactured' additions, even organic ones. For example, commercial yeast won't be added to the wine, instead harnessing naturally occurring yeasts from the grapes and winery - the ultimate expression of **terroir**.

### The issue of... *sulphites*

Sulphur dioxide (SO<sub>2</sub>) is used by many winemakers to preserve wine and prevent oxidation. Natural wine has no added sulphur (although some may naturally occur). Apart from the fact that the idea of pumping chemicals into your wine is a bit unpleasant, the use of SO<sub>2</sub> has been linked to allergic reactions, asthma and much worse hangovers.



# Green(er) Wine

**You wouldn't want to eat badly reared meat or unsustainable fish, so why drink wine that is full of chemicals and bad for the planet?**

At Farmyard our wines are chosen with ethics and sustainability in mind. All wine has an impact on the environment, but, just as with food, there are ways to drink greener. Most of our range is natural or biodynamic, and others are low intervention and organic. We call it #GreenWine.

## how is our wine sustainable?

Working out whether a wine is sustainable or not is a complicated business, but a few of the key principles to consider are whether farming methods are organic, water and energy efficiency in the vineyard and winery, and whether winery workers are paid fairly and treated well. Transportation is also an important issue, which is why the majority of our wines are from Europe (and Sussex and Kent). We believe a few treats are worth bringing in from further afield, though

## last but not least... we love it

At the end of the day, what is the point in natural, sustainable or biodynamic wine if it doesn't taste great. For us, natural wine is exciting and expressive on the palate, it is wine with a story to tell and a direct connection to its roots. We believe that what's in your glass should reflect its natural environment - grapes and growers going their own way, a true taste of terroir and its people.



### **naturally vegan + vegetarian**

The reason that not all wine is vegetarian or vegan is the way that it is clarified through a process known as 'fining'. Common agents used for this are casein (milk protein), albumin (egg whites), gelatin (animal protein) and isinglass (fish bladder). Natural wine is unfinned so naturally vegan.
